FAA Plans TRACON Move

The Federal Aviation Administration has proposed consolidating TRACON service from MKG (Muskegon), GRR (Grand Rapids), AZO (Kalamazoo) and LAN (Lansing) into a new, single facility in AZO in 2013. AZO is in the process of designing/building a new air traffic control tower which can absorb the radar services currently provided at the individual airports. The FAA's argument is that the consolidation will save money at no risk to safety. The union representing controllers at the MKG tower are against the proposed consolidation, citing safety concerns and noting that no proof exists that the consolidation will save money. The Muskegon County Board of Commissioners is also against the proposal, worried about the loss of quality jobs. Although it is unclear how many jobs may be affected, there are currently 26 air traffic controllers employed in the MKG facility.

We ask that you get involved and let your voice be heard. Please write a letter and mail/email it to Airport Administration at 99 Sinclair Drive, Muskegon, MI 49441. We will forward your comments to the FAA, concerned legislators, and local officials.

Executive Air Transport Hosts Italian Helicopter Team



Since mid November, representatives from the Italian helicopter manufacturer, AgustaWestland, have considered Executive Air Transport and Muskegon their home away from home. The AgustaWestland Ice Trials Team consists of 20 members ranging from mechanics, technicians, scientists, and pilots.

The group chose the Muskegon area because of the facility and the winter weather patterns associated with Lake Michigan. The objective of their visit is to obtain data which the team will use in gaining "Known Icing Certification" for the 15,000 pound AgustaWestland 139 helicopter. This long and lengthy process of flying into icing conditions has proven very successful this winter with our longer and colder than normal winter season. In fact, more successful than their previous flight testing conducted in Minnesota and Alaska. "We have been very satisfied with the flight testing in this area and the people of Muskegon have been great to work with," said Test Pilot Nigel Talbot. He and the AgustaWestland team are nearly finished with the flight testing and hope to have the approval by European aviation officials, Transport Canada, and the Federal Aviation Administration before the end of this year. "This is a long and detailed process to obtain the certification for icing," says Talbot.

The AgustaWestland 139 is a new generation twin turbine powered helicopter which is currently in service throughout the world. Owners of this model include governments, corporations, search and rescue organizations, law enforcement agencies, and medical response teams. When approval for flights into "Known Icing Conditions" is received, AgustaWestland will have the only helicopter in its class in the world with this approval. According to Executive Air Transport President Rex Vanderlinde, the flight testing team is expected to remain in Muskegon until late April or early May. "We have really enjoyed hosting our Italian friends this winter and look forward to them visiting Muskegon in the future with additional projects." Checked Luggage

Paying for checked luggage is the norm these days.

All customers that have purchased their tickets on or after November 12, 2008, for coach travel within the U.S. are charged \$15 each way for the first bag. The second bag is \$25 each way. The third is \$125 each way and the fourth to tenth is \$200 each way. There is a 50 pound weight limit per bag.

If you are a WorldPerks Elite or SkyMiles Medallion member, you are allowed up to 2 free bags. All passengers traveling international are allowed up to 2 free bags.
