From the Airport Manager

As you may have already heard, Delta/Mesaba Airlines has taken the first step towards federally subsidized service at MKG. Because of reduced passenger demand, Mesaba indicated in a July letter to the U.S.D.O.T that revenue had fallen and the cost of maintaining MKG-DTW service was not being covered. Mesaba also indicated that without a federal subsidy under the Essential Air Service (EAS) program, they could not continue to serve Muskegon.



The EAS program was created when the airline industry was deregulated in 1978. The purpose of the program is to maintain the vital link to the air transportation network in smaller communities. Approximately 140 cities have air service because of the EAS program. Several criteria exist for an airport to be eligible for EAS funds, and MKG meets all of those criteria. Muskegon is one of eight cities where Mesaba is seeking an EAS subsidy.

The next step in this process includes the U.S.D.O.T. issuing an RFP, asking for proposals from airlines to continue commercial service in MKG. Delta/Mesaba intends to bid and continue serving MKG with DTW service. Other carriers are eligible to bid as well. As the incumbent carrier, chances are that Delta/Mesaba will win the RFP. The transition into EAS service is expected to be seamless with no disruption in service.

The bottom line is that Delta/Mesaba is committed to serving MKG. They could have pulled service altogether, but in recognition of past performance and the expectation that the recession will end and people will start flying again, they fully intend to maintain a presence.

MKG Awarded 2nd Consecutive Balchen-Post Award

For the second consecutive year, the “snow crew” at the Muskegon County Airport has been awarded the Balchen/Post Award for Excellence in the Performance of Snow and Ice Control. The award is sponsored by the Northeast Chapter – American Association of Airport Executives.

The hours of planning and training needed to execute a comprehensive Snow and Ice Control Plan can easily go unnoticed. But when an aircraft needs to land or take off at Muskegon County Airport, rest assured the Airport snow crew is on the job, providing the safest environment possible for aircraft operations.

“The employees at the Airport obviously take their jobs seriously,” commented Bill Gill, Muskegon County Transportation Committee Chairman. “And now their extraordinary efforts to provide an accessible, efficient transportation portal are being recognized on an international level.”

MKG Awarded \$800,000 in Federal Stimulus Funds

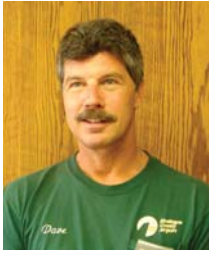
MKG was recently awarded \$800,000 under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009 to purchase a new Aircraft Rescue and Fire Fighting (ARFF) vehicle. The new ARFF vehicle will replace a 1993 Oshkosh fire truck, catapulting MKG into the 21st century with the latest fire fighting technologies. The new ARFF vehicle will provide the necessary fire fighting capabilities as required by the Federal Aviation Regulation Part 139 for an Index A airport.

Rosenbauer Firefighting Technology was awarded the bid to provide the new ARFF vehicle. The vehicle is a rapid intervention Panther 4x4, holding 1500 gallons of water, 205 gallons of Aqueous Film Forming Foam (AFFF) and 500 pounds of Purple K. The AFFF is used to fight fuel fires, while the Purple K is used to fight electrical fires.

As a large and complex vehicle, it takes time to build the Panther 4x4; expected delivery is March 31, 2010. For more information on Rosenbauer Firefighting Technology, visit their website at <http://www.rosenbaueramerica.com/indexa.php>.

Pre-Pay Baggage Fees

Pre-pay baggage fees during nwa.com check-in or at a self-service kiosk by selecting the number of bags you will be checking and providing a credit card. Your credit card will be charged at the airport baggage drop when your baggage tags are printed. If necessary, you can change the number of checked bags at an airport kiosk before your baggage tags are printed.

Effective for tickets purchased on or after July 16, 2009, for travel on or after August 4, 2009, customers traveling domestically who pre-pay baggage fees on nwa.com or delta.com will be charged \$15 for the first checked bag and \$25 for the second checked bag. Customers traveling domestically who check in and pay bag fees at an airport kiosk or with an agent will incur a \$5 surcharge for the first and second checked bags.

Special Note: For Silver Medallion/Silver Elite and higher status, checked baggage fees are waived for EVERYONE in your itinerary. Passengers can not be just traveling together, they must be in the SAME itinerary.
